Recently thefts of stone have been occurring, mainly from rural properties and farm buildings. Stone flags, coping stones and pillar caps are amongst the items targeted. Residents are asked to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity that they may see. Vehicles are usually involved in this type of theft and the make and model and registration number would be very useful.

Also, in recent times, arrests have been made in other areas covered by the Chorley Rural East Neighbourhood Policing Team for the cultivation and possession of cannabis. Bulb Planting

The bulb planting carried out last year is now 'bearing fruit' with new flowers springing up in many of the grass verges.

Around 8,000 crocus, snowdrop and daffodil bulbs were planted, throughout the parish, last autumn in an attempt to brighten up our roadsides.

Heapey and Wheelton Village Hall

The refurbishment work has progressed very well. The new heating system is in place and the suspended ceilings, insulation and lighting are completed.

The condition survey of the building highlighted several problems and a full upgrade of the electrics has been completed, together with the installation of a damp course. We still have a number of items to attend to including an update of the fire alarm system, building works including pointing and sealing of brickwork, replacement wall ties, removal of chimney stack, new drain to prevent flooding under the floor at the rear of the building, replacement guttering, downpipes and fascias, sanding and sealing of the wooden floors and several other items.

We are still working to secure funding for solar panels, an upgrade of the kitchen facilities and essential maintenance items.

Food Waste Recycling

Chorley Council has introduced food waste collections to all properties which currently receive recycling collections.

Leftovers, out-of-date food and vegetable peelings will be just some of the food waste that people will be able to recycle as we look to boost our already high recycling rate (currently the highest in Lancashire).

Food waste accounts for up to one third of what we throw away in the green bins so it will help us turn more of our waste into compost - and it could save pounds on your shopping bill too! For lots of tips on saving money and using food wisely you can visit www.lovefoodhatewaste.com

How does it work? - Residents who currently have a brown bin will simply be asked to put their food waste in their brown bin with their garden waste. You can wrap it in newspaper, if you wish, or simply put it straight in with your garden waste.

What is classed as food waste? - any raw or cooked food you have at home such as:

- out of date food
- meat, fish and chicken bones
- tea bags
- bread and pastries
- cheese
- Leftovers

Please note all food must be taken out of its packaging before it is placed in your brown bin.

Council Tax Freeze!

Following on from last year's reduction the Parish Council precept for 2012-2013 has been held at the same figure as 2011-2012.

Services provided by the Parish Council from the precept include bulb planting on grass verges, wayside seats, the Christmas trees and lights, Parish Council noticeboards, relevant insurance cover, contributions towards the ongoing provision of the Heapey and Wheelton Play Area and maintenance of the War Memorial Grounds. Assistance is also provided for the upkeep of the Village Hall and War Memorial. Heapey and Wheelton Parish Councils are joint trustees of, with ultimate responsibility for, Heapey and Wheelton Village Hall, but the day to day running and maintenance is carried out by the Village Hall Committee.
